up with, well, half a million dollars one...the first year and seven hundred plus thousand the second. Is that how you interpret this?

SENATOR BROWN: Yes, and that is a fiscal note from...from last year. There is...but it is a substantial fiscal impact and that is something that I was going to address in my remarks. Much of that can probably be...we can receive federal funds to cover it.

SENATOR BAKER: Well, I...thank you, Senator Brown. I just...I look at this as saying, how does government grow and this is a perfect example and very noble cause. I...I'm with Senator Stuhr. I want the best child-care providers for my grandchildren as I can have, but I can't see how requiring an additional ten hours of education is going to change a lot of things. And...and the second...well, first issue I guess is the cost. How in the world are we going to pay for this thing when we're scrambling to find a few bucks here and a few bucks there? And this has long-term budget considerations involved here, adding staff and obviously increased rates of subsidies. And I, granted, some of it may come from the federal government but, the tight budget they're in, I wouldn't count on that anymore either. So we're talking about, oh, \$700,000 a year, something like that, we're going to have to find and I don't think that we're going to find \$700,000 laying around in a drawer anymore. The second issue that I bring up is the "Family Childcare Home Compliance Guide". You talk about rules and regulations and so on, this thing is 90 pages long, 90 pages of directions and suggestions and so on. And it's not like we have no training now. We have this twelve-hour requirement, twelve clock hours of training on an annual basis. And I heard this before, the remark that we're repeating the same issues as we go back each year and have this annual training. We don't get anything new that maybe would take more than 30 minutes or an hour. I...I have not been to one of these training sessions. I have family members that have and obviously constituents that have and they say it's duplicative of what we're doing; it's...there's nothing new in it, as a rule. They have to be recertified for CPR. There are some changes in that each...seems every few years, which are some new...new procedures and that, but that's aside from this. That...that training counts toward the 12 hours, but
