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see whether we should get the 25 or not. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Engel.

SENATOR ENGEL: I call the question, please.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Do I see five hands? I do. Question before the body is, shall debate cease? All in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to cease debate.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Debate ceases. Senator Dierks, you're recognized to close on your motion to suspend the rules.

SENATOR DIERKS: Mr. Speaker, could I ask for a call of the house?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: There's been a request to place the house under call. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The house is under call. Would all members please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Senator Dierks, pursuant to rule, this is still on your time, so I'll...I'll not call them and I'll let you continue.
