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outside a reservation within the proposed gaming interdiction zone, the gaming would not be covered by IGRA. That was their opinion and...Senator Coordsen, did you want to...did you want to respond? Okay. I thought that was the question that you were asking. It isn't. Okay, then I misunderstood and maybe you can ask your question again on the mike when I'm listening more closely. But I would...I would ask that the body vote no on this amendment. This is a bill that was not advanced from committee and it probably has some...some justification for being decided on its own merit, but I think that it would be the death knell for LR 6CA. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Coordsen, you're recognized to close on your amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: In my closing, I would ask Senator Schimek a question, if she would respond.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator, would you respond?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes.

SENATOR COORDSEN: My question, Senator, that we talked about off the mike a few moments ago related to gaming on tribal lands as your amendment provides for.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And that would definitely be regulated by IGRA.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Yeah, and so that anything that we authorize, we being a future legislature, anywhere would be available by contract to, under the provisions of IGRA. That's my understanding of how it works anyway in other states.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Not anywhere, Senator.

SENATOR COORDSEN: I mean on tribal lands.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: On tribal lands.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Whatever we...whatever the Legislature
