SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. At this point in time we will go down on the agenda to our 11:15 item, General File, LB 429. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 429, a bill by Senator Janssen and others. (Read title.) Bill was introduced on January 9, referred to the Health Committee, advanced to General File. Bill has been discussed, Mr. President, both last year and this year. Committee amendments have been adopted. There was a motion to bracket the bill last year that prevailed. Mr. President, when the Legislature left the bill, I believe on February 6, Senator Chambers had pending a motion to recommit to committee. Senator, I do have a note that you want to withdraw that motion at this time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, that's correct.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: It's withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, then we're back to an amendment to the bill by Senator Janssen. Senator Janssen, I have in front of me AM2560. Senator, I believe you had presented to the Legislature. (Legislative Journal page 499.)

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Janssen, I'm going to give you just a couple minutes to refresh the body what that amendment is, couple minutes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and thank you for allowing me to bring this back for discussion. The amendment reduces the amount of reimbursement in the contract with the grocers from twelve cents to five...or from nine cents to five
