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SENATOR CHAMBERS: And if this bill gets all the way across the board, is there going to be an A bill? And maybe this has been touched on.

SENATOR BRUNING: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What will the A bill be?

SENATOR BRUNING: My understanding is, as the bill is written now, \$1.8 million.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If that amount...

SENATOR BRUNING: And that's...I'm sorry, Senator, let me clarify. That's for state employees, \$600,000 for county employees, \$2.4 million total.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. But at any rate, because for my question, that difference doesn't make too much difference. Do you think that this bill has a chance of surviving a gubernatorial veto? Let me ask a preliminary question. Do you think the Governor will sign this bill?

SENATOR BRUNING: I think he'll...I think he'll, you know, make his decision when the bill is in front of him, but sure, I think there's a chance he'll sign it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So it's your belief at this point that there's a chance he will sign the bill?

SENATOR BRUNING: There's a chance, Senator, but I haven't spoken with him about it so I guess I don't know for sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I understand. If he would veto it, would you vote to override his veto?

SENATOR BRUNING: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you think there are 29 others who will vote to override the vet? I'm just curious.
