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SENATOR COORDSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...in their Cash Fund. I am going to get those numbers for you and give them to you tomorrow.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Well, I have them.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Okay, but...I understand...

SENATOR COORDSEN: I have them so...

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...I understand their cash balance is about half of what it was about four years ago and...

SENATOR COORDSEN: Well, the last three years it's stayed about \$4.8 million or thereabouts.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Um-hum.

SENATOR COORDSEN: But, no, I was...I was curious if they want...want...if they need more money what do they need more money for. Because, as Senator Smith indicated to the body, a fee is a tax, a tax is a fee. Anything we charge for services rendered by government is, in fact, a tax and I'm just curious as to what is...is going to be received by the public for the additional money. Thank you, Senator Schrock. Thank you, Mr. Chair.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Senator Chambers, part three of the divided question.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'd like to ask Senator Schrock a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Do you yield, Senator Schrock?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schrock, you support increasing these fees and you cannot tell us with precision what the fee increase will be used for because Game and Parks has not told anybody and will not tell anybody. Is part of the money that funds Game and Parks derived from General Funds?
