SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bruning.

SENATOR BRUNING: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I wanted to discuss a little more my comments earlier about the archbishop, and I first want to say I have a deep respect for Senator Foley and a deep respect for the Catholic Church, and I see this as, you know, when two...when two brothers fight, the fight is often more severe than when strangers do. That's somewhat how I see our disagreement here. But I wanted...I want to talk a little bit more about our disagreement because I think Senator Foley's chief concern was with my comments about the archbishop. And if I have my facts wrong I'll rescind my comments, but I don't think I do. To my understanding, there was a priest in the church under the archbishop's direct employ who was looking at child pornography and the archbishop found out about that and, rather than discipline that person and send him to get help for that sickness, he did nothing. He reassigned him and allowed that priest to continue to have contact with children. So what I said about the archbishop, that he should be removed, and I did say that he was not worthy of his position, was based upon the fact that the archbishop knew that one of his priests was looking at child pornography. In my mind, somebody that's looking at child pornography is one step away from a pedophile and the step is a small step. It's a big step from where the vast majority of people are to look at child pornography. It's a little step once you get to look at child pornography to be a pedophile. It's a couple glasses of wine or some unexpected courage. And if the archbishop knew about this, and according to the Omaha World-Herald he did, and if the archbishop, indeed, reassigned this person, then the archbishop is at fault. And I tell you what, I don't distinguish between the archbishop and any other manager. If there is somebody in one of our state agencies in this state that has somebody under their direct employ that's looking at child pornography and they find out about it and they don't do anything about it, that person needs to go too. There's no use or purpose for child pornography or condoning it through keeping somebody who is interested in it in an organization, and that's
