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why I say it's atrociously drafted? Rather than taking the definition of a peace officer, I'm paraphrasing, they'll say a peace officer is a person who works for a police department, the State Patrol or the sheriff's department of the state or a political subdivision engaged in apprehending criminals, fighting crime and enforcing the state's laws. Whoever heard of such a thing like that anywhere but in a comic book? But that shows what they think of the state of Nebraska. All they'd have to do to define a peace officer is go to the definition that exists in statute right now. What do they pay people for if they're supposed to be pushing bills like this? And this is why I refer to some of these things as trash legislation. I don't like the bill. In committee I was not going to waste my time on it, but the committee didn't do anything of substance either because it wasn't supposed to go anywhere. It was just supposed to be let out of the committee as a favor and it winds up as a priority bill. There was a situation where this little fox, little fox cub, and a puppy dog were friends, and while they were little, little tykes they got along with each other, but then they grew up. There was a wise old owl, whose voice was that of...I think it may have been Pearl Bailey, and she kept telling this little puppy dog, you better get yourself some education, honey,...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...because he didn't understand that while a puppy is in the puppy stage and a fox is in the cub stage, or whatever you call a baby fox, they could kind of get along, but as they grew up things happen. There was a point where the dog could have killed the fox, but he remembered when they were little and the dog let him go and he said, I'm going to let you go this time but don't let me catch you again because foxes and dogs don't get along. You can't run with the foxes and hunt with the hounds. Well, Senator Connealy is in that situation on this bill, but I'm not going to harry and worry the bill at this stage. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.
