SENATOR HUDKINS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. The Rules Committee did meet just a few minutes ago and did come to an agreement on the rules proposals that will be presented to the body on Monday. Those proposals will be distributed to your boxes this afternoon. So if you can hear what I'm saying or the staffs or whatever, please try to pick those up yet today so your senator can look at them over the weekend, because Monday morning we will be discussing the rules. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Hudkins. Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, more new bills. (Read LB 230-232 by title for the first time.) In addition to that, Mr. President, several resolutions: LR 4CA, offered by Senator Schrock and others, is a proposed constitutional amendment to preserve the right to fish, trap and hunt, subject to reasonable restrictions as prescribed by law; LR 5 by Senator Stuhr recognizes Suzanne Ratzlaff as the teacher of the year for 2003; LR 6CA by Senator Schrock is a proposed constitutional amendment to define gaming, to authorize creation of an interdiction gaming zone, to permit gaming in an interdiction gaming zone and within licensed racetrack enclosures; LR 7CA by Senator Schrock and others is a proposed constitutional amendment to change term limit provisions for the Legislature by limiting members elected or appointed for terms beginning after January 1, 2001, to three consecutive full four-year terms.

In addition, Mr. President, I have a series of announcements of Vice-Chairmanships. Senator Connealy is Vice Chair of Revenue; Senator Smith, Vice Chair of Government; Connealy as Vice Chair of Urban Affairs; Don Pederson, Appropriations; Senator Erdman, Agriculture; Senator Burling, Business and Labor; Senator Tyson, Banking; Senator Maxwell, Vice Chair of Education; Senator Stuhr, Vice Chair of Natural Resources; Senator Jones, Vice Chair of Transportation and Telecommunications.

I have a Reference Committee report, as adopted by the Executive Board earlier this morning, and a series of rules changes that will be printed in the Journal, Mr. President, and that's all
