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**SPEAKER BROMM:** Senator Chambers, you may continue.

**SENATOR CHAMBERS:** Mr. Speaker, I'm enjoying this discussion. It's kind of nourishing my soul. And those who come here to pray every morning or listen to prayer every morning should enjoy this too, because I'm getting down to the nuts and bolts of the kind of things that I'm subjected to as a member of this Legislature because those things are done in this Chamber, where I live, work, and have my being as a politician. So if that Almighty, whether he's called God, Allah, Jehovah, Buddha or whoever, is invited into this Chamber, I'm going to talk about him, them, her, it, they or whatever. Now, if you all are going to do all this praying every day, and your rules allow for it, then I want to see some evidence that that prayer is of some value. I know that that one you pray to has no control over your lives. We can just check that out and know that he has no control whatsoever there. But when it comes to these money matters, he ought to have something to say about it or you all ought to stop standing up there praying every morning. What's it for? It's a mockery. It's humbug. It's foolishness. You just as well pray to Mickey Mouse, Donald Duck and Goofy as to the Father, Son and that other one. Now you all don't like what I'm saying; I don't like the prayers. Why don't you all go to some building that the lobbyists set up if you've got to pray every morning? I'm denied the use of this Chamber every morning. Now I could come in here and sit down while they're up there going through their incantations, but I don't want to be rude. I don't want to be discourteous. But I'm certainly not going to be quiet while these kind of things are going on and act as though they don't offend me. But I do not come up here to try to embarrass you all in the way that I am upset by what you all do. And I'm running out of time, so I'm going to have to put an amendment or a motion or two on Senator Jensen's bill so that I can get more into the essence of the bill itself, because I have digressed. And, Senator Jensen, I'm not going to try to kill your bill by way of an indefinite postponement motion, but I'm going to try to discourage my colleagues from voting for your bill. And since that motion is up there, I'll have the opportunity to go into a greater discussion with you and a deeper discussion, because you have not given to me what
