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SENATOR JANSSEN: I have no idea.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It doesn't cost as much as being planted in the ground.

SENATOR JANSSEN: That could be. I am not familiar with them, and I hope I don't have to be for...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Since these various entities are the ones that are going to pay the cost of this policy, I'm not going to oppose it, but I just didn't understand why we have to enact a bill to tell people to do what they want to do anyway.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, I think, generally, most of them have, but there are some departments that have just drug their feet, and I'm sure it's not because of the fact that the money couldn't be there to do this, that we're talking about a small amount of money in raising that up to it's...to a value where it would help with funeral expenses.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I want you to understand...

SENATOR JANSSEN: And that's why we have it, excuse me, but as long as you got me going here, in 1971, apparently, I don't know how you voted for that in 1971. You were here, weren't you, because it was...it is in the statutes now?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, it's not the amount. I was trying to understand, since these groups, I looked at who favored this bill, all of them are able to do this now and I'm wondering why they are asking the Legislature to authorize them to do what they already can do under the law, and what they say they want to do, and I still don't understand. I'm not going to vote against your bill, but I just don't understand what this is about.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, I think there are some departments that haven't done this. I don't believe the particular one that is in my community has raised that to \$10,000, but with this, they
