SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, let me ask you this. How much is the habitat stamp, if you have that before you?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, I do. I have that. It was \$1.5 million.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now how much does an individual habitat stamp cost? That's what I need, if you have it.

SENATOR STUHR: Um...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Because I want to add that to what the hunting license is, so we will know how much a person really has to pay to hunt in Nebraska. Because when we add the cost of the habitat stamp, it will push Nebraska above \$11. So this...these figures are somewhat disingenuous. It seems to me that maybe Game and Parks can tell us how much is the cost of the habitat stamp. So, while I'm talking, maybe you or Senator Schrock could ask them how much is the habitat stamp.

SENATOR STUHR: It is...it is actually on the handout that you received. The habitat stamp is currently \$13, and the aquatic habitat stamp is \$5.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So...

SENATOR STUHR: But, again, this may not...the states that we looked at with strictly hunting and fishing,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But wait a minute.

SENATOR STUHR: ...they may also have habitat stamps.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But, Senator Stuhr,...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...the resident hunting license is \$11, and when we add that \$13 habitat stamp that I spent so much time talking about, it pushes it up to \$24, doesn't it? To hunt in Nebraska, if you're a resident, you have to pay at least \$24, don't you?
