think most states have provision for a certain amount of monies. But where this \$40 million is coming from I don't have a clue. I just ask you to take Jerry Bauerkamper's word for it. And, Senator Brown, at some point we do need to talk about revenues. And at some point, I suspect on Select File, maybe we can get to more particulars on that. With that, Mr. President, I don't think I'm going to support this Chamber (sic) amendment right now, although I think it's okay, and I think I would like to support it on Select File. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Chambers.
