on LB 756A.

SENATOR McDONALD: This appropriations bill I think is about \$5,500. It is basically the amount of money that we need to implement the cancer repository drug regulations and requirements. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the opening on LB 756A. Open for discussion. Seeing no lights on, Senator McDonald, did you wish to close on your motion? She waives the opportunity to close on her motion. The question before the body is advancement of LB 756A. All in favor of the motion vote aye, and opposed nay. We're voting on advancement of LB 756A to E & R Initial. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 756A.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 756A does advance. Next agenda item is General File, 2003 committee priority bills. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next bill is LB 608, a bill by Senator Landis. (Read title.) The bill has been discussed by the Legislature on March 17, 18, and 19. When the Legislature adjourned yesterday, Senator Landis had presented the third component of the committee amendments. Mr. President, FA1206, again, characterized as the slaughterhouses sections of the committee amendment. I do have an amendment to this component, Mr. President. (FA1206, Legislative Journal page 996.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Landis, would you give us a brief review on where we are with the third component of the divided committee amendments?

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. We have adopted what we called "the rest," sections that were not particularly controversial in the bill. We took out the Revenue Committee's language on disclosure. We substituted the language that Senator Brashear brought to us. That was adopted to the bill. We opened on this piece, which is an exclusion of the
