ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion to adopt was successful. Mr. Clerk, next item to the bill.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment by Senator Beutler is AM1016.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, you're recognized to open on AM1016 to LB 46.

SENATOR BEUTLER: And that's the one I would withdraw, Mr. Clerk.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, next item to the bill.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Dwite Pedersen and Schimek would move to amend with AM0819. (Legislative Journal page 1205.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Pedersen, you're recognized to open on your amendment, AM0819, to LB 46.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. This amendment is actually LB 522, which I introduced to adopt the Interstate Compact for Adult Offender Supervision. The bill was forwarded to the full Legislature by the Judiciary Committee by a vote of 6 to 1 with one member abstaining and one member absent. The Council of State Governments, in collaboration with the National Institute of Corrections, have been working to get this bill adopted throughout the United States. In order for the compact to take effect, legislation had to be passed in 35 states and
