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has some free time while she is at home with her children. So I think that we have at our disposal in this state many people with skills that would serve our population, people who are willing to do that, and I thank Senator Brown for bringing this. I thank the committee for amending it onto the bill, and I hope that you will advance it. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK:      Thank you, Senator Redfield.      Senator Johnson.

SENATOR JOHNSON:      Senator Cudaback, I'd rise to support the idea that Senator Brown brings forward. One of the things that I can actually kind of speak of personally in this case is that at age 66 I have quite a few friends that are about my age as well that have retired or are thinking of doing it, and I guess I liken this situation to what we've had with Senator Vickie McDonald's bill that we had earlier where we use drugs that cancerous patients, or people with cancer, had had and then can't use. Here we have the same type of resource, only this time it's a human resource rather than a medication. And it's the sort of thing that with the...if we can give these people adequate protection so they don't lose their life savings, et cetera, or make the cost of donating their services too high, that I think that here's the potential for helping quite a few people.

SENATOR CUDABACK:      Thank you, Senator Johnson.      Senator Brashear, there are no further lights. You're recognized to close on FA1315, if you care to.      Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR:      Thank you, Mr. President.      Members of the body, this is the first division of the committee amendment. It includes some amendment to Senator Pederson's...Don Pederson's original LB 146, all of Senator Brown's LB 162, and a portion of my LB 23, and I would urge the adoption of this division of the question in its entirety. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK:      Thank you, Senator Brashear. The question before the body is adoption of the first component of the divided original committee amendments, which is all of the committee amendments outside of Section 1. All in favor of the motion vote aye, and opposed nay. Voting on FA1315, which is
