SENATOR MINES: It feels more administrative than it does legislative. And I...it, to me, on the surface, makes sense that the school association should make those kinds of decisions, as opposed to this body. But if it's in statute now, then it makes sense that this body gets involved. And that's really all I had to ask.
