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reason or the reason this is included along with the budget package is that there are fee changes dealing with the regulation in higher education institutions, private postsecondary schools, a fee change and that makes this then relevant to the budget discussions we're having. As far as the teaching certificates, the main thrust here has been an effort...there has been a task force that's been at work for a year or more dealing with the issue of how do we revise our requirements for teachers...teaching certificates so as to make it possible for talented individuals, experienced individuals to be productively employed, if you will, in our school systems? The current provisions regarding teaching certificates would be modified. The types of certificates would be streamlined as would the terminology regarding the termination of a certificate. Special services certificates would be introduced for individuals in medically related fields, coaches, and subject areas for which endorsement programs are not offered by standard institutions of higher education. Employment experience would be allowed to meet requirements for human relations training, special education training, and basic skills competency. Turning, and you can...I would refer to you to the committee statement, which is, I think, very complete. I will summarize the second part of the provisions dealing with private postsecondary career schools. Private colleges and private postsecondary career schools would be required to petition the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education for approval before extending their program offerings to the baccalaureate degree or higher degree level. Private postsecondary career schools would petition through the Department of Education to the Commission. The Department would refer the application to the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education for approval. Private postsecondary career schools that are both approved to offer baccalaureate or higher degrees and regionally accredited would no longer be under the jurisdiction of the Department of Education. Short-term training and employer provided education would also be exempt from the Private Postsecondary Career School Act. Authorization would be provided to increase fees charged to private postsecondary career schools. And, again, that last is the reason that we are discussing this as a part of our budget deliberations. I'll mention that we're amending by adding a \$200 fee for the initial
