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session that it was appropriate.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Okay. The other question that I would have then, I guess, for Senator Beutler would be how was the term of the members on the commission arrived at, as far as the length of service, if their...I believe it says the original appointments last for two years, assuming that the commission will immediately undertake the idea of reviewing compensation, make a report, and then every four years after they will make a report in addition. So every four years they're going to be required to make one report. How was the term arrived at, the six-year period for those members? Was that to allow the first members of the commission to then also have an opportunity to make the second recommendation, or was there a different rationale?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah. I think the only thought was to allow for one whole cycle at the beginning and then the term could be any number of years the Legislature thinks is appropriate. And I'm certainly flexible on that, Senator, as I'm sure the committee would have probably some flexibility on that.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Okay. Those are all the questions I had. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Erdman. Senator Schimek, on the Exec Board amendment.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members. If I might, I would like to ask Senator Beutler just another question or two.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, would you respond?
