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county jail. I used to get calls from prisoners and complaints and, you know, maybe there's a way to eliminate some of that from happening and maybe it takes a little bit of the burden off the elected officials,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...but I think we should go slowly on this and consider keeping things the way they are. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Thompson. Senator Chambers. I'm sorry, Senator Aguilar, did you have your light on? You may speak.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Thank you. I do want to address one. I appreciate the extended debate and the opinions of the members of the body, and I'm getting a good feel of where people are, especially Senator Chambers and Senator Schimek. Some of the others are a little questionable. But as far as some of the things Senator Thompson said, I would disagree with her statement that we would create a patchwork of different facilities across the state. I would remind the body that this jail would still have to be run with the same standards that every jail is run right now. And as far as problems with the jail, you know, every jail we have experiences problems right now. Which senator in here has not got a phone call or a letter from a prisoner saying that he wasn't treated fairly? I mean that just happens. That's the matter of the beast. I would appreciate hearing from more senators. I really would like to get a feel where the body is on this and have you ask the questions that I think we need to ask and answer. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Aguilar. Senator Chambers, on your motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'd like to ask Senator Aguilar a few more questions.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Aguilar, would you respond?
