to come into play. His suggestion is 25 miles per hour or less. I think it should be 20. He has raised the issue of safety and I believe that the Legislature should not put into statute a bill that is going to compromise the safety of young people. The last vote indicated that the body wants to keep them ignorant. I want to keep them safe. I failed in my effort to make it possible to inform them. I'm not going to fail in the effort to keep them safe. Now, maybe in the present form of this bill, the introducer can get 33 votes to advance it in its present problematic form. You did it once. Perhaps you'll do it again. But I would like to ask Senator Aguilar a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Aguilar, would you respond?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes, I would.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Aguilar, you did not have the opportunity to react to Senator Quandahl's proposal because my amendment was put up there right away. What is your reaction to his proposal?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Well, as you can see, I have my light on. I had originally intended to get up and oppose his amendment, and now I will just do the same with yours.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: H'm, so you're going to give the old one-two. Okay. Thank you, Senator Aguilar. Now we know that we have "Foley Junior" on this bill. Now there is less of Senator Aguilar to chop on than there was on Senator Foley, but I'm sure that he will respond very well to the chopping that is going to take place. Senator Aguilar, when we are talking about young people, we have to be very careful when they are going to be placed in a set of circumstances where they are at risk. I think you recall that during the discussion of this bill earlier I had serious problems with the bill, but now I have been encouraged by events to do all I can to see that this bill does not become law, because what it allows is unsafe activity. So let me ask you another question, while you're on your feet and you said you're going to oppose my amendment. As the green copy reads, your bill would say, on page 4, starting in line 27, then I continue on to page 5: "It is unlawful for the operator of a
