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about doing it is to offer to strike various sections. I'm going to start with the committee amendment, and that is AM2348. So the amendment that I have up there would say, in the committee amendment, strike Section 3. Now, Section 3 relates to the Adjutant General not having to take unpaid leave, I believe, which means that if there is...well, I will read the language, beginning in line 21. "Due to the interrelated nature of the Adjutant General's state and federal duties, the Adjutant General shall not be required to take paid or unpaid leave or leaves of absence to perform his or her federal duties, whether or not under federal orders." That would mean that if the Adjutant General is under federal orders to perform a duty, and that duty is strictly federal, the Adjutant General would continue to receive a salary. At this point, I'd like to ask Senator...I guess I'll ask Senator Vrtiska, because he's standing.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Will you yield, Senator Vrtiska?

SENATOR VRTISKA: Yes, I will.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Vrtiska, this salary that the Adjutant General will receive is paid by which government, state or federal?

SENATOR VRTISKA: State.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And does the money that the National Guard uses to pay this salary come from state funds or federal funds that were given to the state for this purpose, for running the National Guard, if you know?

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, frankly, I'm going to pass on that, because I'm not sure. But I got the material here, if you give me a minute to look it up while you're...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Discussing.

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...pursuing this.
