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That should be my agenda for the next four years, and I will have a lot less work to do and the rural people will be messed on a lot more. But as long as my conscience whips me in the way it does if I do not obey it, I will obey my conscience. I'd rather face you all's anger than the ire of my conscience. It may have been Solomon who said, your fathers whipped you, beat you with whips, I will lash you with scorpions. Scorpions were not the little critters with the sting in the tail. They were multipronged whips that had bits of bone and other implements that would lacerate the flesh.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You all try to use whips. My conscience uses scorpions and knows how to wield it with a vengeance. So I am going to talk about the wrongfulness of trying to attack I-300, and I'm going to condemn the Governor for using it as a campaign ploy. He doesn't care about the rural people. They don't have sense enough to vote against him, but if he can get the corporations' favor, he'll get some money, and money buys elections. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. (Visitors introduced.) Senator Chambers, there are no further lights on on the motion to return. You're recognized to close if you care to.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I care to close, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, the hard work I do around here justifies me in taking out after the Legislature and after my colleagues when they do things or fail to do things that they ought to do, in my opinion. I know there are other people on the floor with opinions but they won't express them. But I'm going to express mine and put what I have on my mind that pertains to what we're doing into the record. I don't throw a rock and hide my hand. Now back to this amendment that I'm talking about. When term limits kicks in, if it successfully does so, and eliminates me at the conclusion of the next 4-year term should I win reelection, the Legislature ought to consider hiring me in two capacities; one is to review every bill that's introduced to find flaws; not in the thrust of the bill, that would not be my
