job, not making policy. But when they are amending existing law, read through it to see if there are problems such as this, that's one capacity. What's the other one? A long-term, long-range job starting with volume 1 of the Nebraska Revised Statutes, on page 1, start reading, and on every page where I find something which ought to be changed, not with reference to policy but grammar, syntax, inappropriate descriptions of what an official is authorized to do, it will be my job to find that and bring it to the attention of the appropriate persons connected with the Legislature, and they can try to find somebody to offer legislation to correct it. That should give me a job for the remaining years that I have on this earth and the total number will be about 120. So I'll be around for awhile. I'll be able to perform a service to the state that is needed to be performed but it never has even been considered. Oh, you all are going to miss me when I'm gone. (Laughter) And you'll miss me in different ways. Some people will miss me in the way that a migraine headache is missed when it abates. Others will miss me as something is missed which is always there to provide stability, a safety net and a fallback. But in either case, things are not going to be the same around here. I'd like to get philosophical. When I croak and when anybody else croaks, nothing is known. So when they start eradicating everything that I've managed to get done in this Legislature and they start heaping terrible things on the public because I'm not here to stop that from happening, I won't know anything about it. Why then should it make me so much difference on these various matters that I give so much time to? I will tell you. Because while I am here and conscious, I know what is going on, I know what ought to be done, and I know the standard that ought to be reached. So as long as I am here,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and I have the wherewithal mentally to grapple with these matters, I intend to do so. I will not be worn out. I will not be run out. A person was in my office the other day and saw my credo written on a piece of paper on the wall. Five words: When I rest, I rust. That explains why I am the way I am, why I do what I do. That's my closing. I ask that we return this bill and make the corrections that Senator
