how the money in those funds will be spent would govern and that's how that money would be spent. However, if a crisis arose or if no crisis arose and the Legislature changed...decided to change the law relative to these funds by putting into some provisos, the Legislature is not prohibited by this constitutional language from doing so. If the Legislature chose, it could attach wording to the statute that creates and governs these funds, words that say simply the Legislature is free to use these funds in whatever way the Legislature deems fit, and that would not be unconstitutional. That which the Legislature creates, the Legislature controls, the Legislature directs in terms of how it is to function, its limitations,...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...its prerogatives, its powers. So I defy anybody to successfully through reasoned argument buttressed by facts and constitutional law to successfully counter what I have said. The main difference between a state constitution and the federal constitution is that the federal constitution grants power to the national government. Anything not granted by the U.S. Constitution the federal government doesn't have. The state constitution, on the other hand, limits the state's powers. Anything not limited to the Legislature by the state constitution can be done by the Legislature as long as it doesn't violate federal law. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Bromm, members of the Legislature, I agree with Senator Chambers with regard to some of the technicalities of the bill, but those can be fixed. And what I want to talk about is why I support not the State Fair as it is, but the State Fair as it could be and the State Fair as it should be. And the reason that I'm supportive, generally, is because there are certain celebrations of time and place that are important to us as a people. And if you ask yourself how do Nebraskans unify themselves, what are the things we participate in that are for all of us, and you know there are events like that. There is Cornhusker football, but that deals with a limited area, the area of sports. There are things that are
