ASSISTANT CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Quandahl's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion was successful. The amendment has been adopted. Anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, I have nothing further at this time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. Senator Mossey, for a motion.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Mr. President, I move the advancement of LB 999 to E & R for engrossing.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the motion to advance LB 999 to E & R for engrossing. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. We now go to General File, 2004 committee priority bills. Mr. Clerk, first bill.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, first bill is LB 869, which was introduced by the Ag Committee and signed by its members (Read title.) Bill was read for the first time on January 7 of this year, referred to the Agriculture Committee. That committee reports the bill to General File with committee amendments attached. (AM2611, Legislative Journal page 627.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Before we go to the opening on that bill, we have a person, he's leaving his teen years and going to his twenties. He's David Thomas. He's up here on the mikes with us, a Page. So let's wish him a happy birthday. Welcome to the twenties. They're not so bad. Senator Kremer, to open on LB 869.
