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about the situation. (Laughter) I don't...I'm adding a little levity to a very, very serious situation, and I, really, I'm not trying to make light of it. This is very serious. It's very significant. I want to make some comments to start with and then I intend to participate in the discussion as it goes along. But first thing I want to say, I want to take my hat off to Senator Jensen. To me, that's the definition, a bill such as this, is a definition of what a true statesman is, what a true leader in this state is, to take an issue, study it for several years, hold hearing after hearing after hearing, invest hours and hours and hours of time, visit the communities many times, and come to a decision that you know is going to be unpopular in those communities but you also know that it's the absolute right decision for Nebraska. And, Senator Jensen, I want to tell you how much I appreciate that. You have done a fantastic job of truly putting Nebraska's interests ahead of everything and anybody else, and I commend you for that. You have my respect for that. This is a huge policy shift, I agree with that, but I think it's also a policy shift that is years and years overdue. If you look at the numbers of how many people are served there in these...in these regional centers, versus who should actually be served there, versus the federal contribution, versus the efficiency, we should have done this years ago. This is...the time to do this is now, I absolutely believe that. In considering efficiency, the federal contribution, the care that these individuals will get, now is the time to do this. I understand there might be some concerns if programs aren't up in place, but I think that can be addressed. But I think now is the time to put Nebraska first and maybe stop being parochial. Put the needs of Nebraska, put the needs of these individuals that need these services ahead of everything else. And again, Senator Jensen, I commend you, the Governor. My hat is off to him as well. To do something that is politically unpopular but is absolutely the right long-term solution for Nebraska is commendable. I intend to support the bill. I also tend...I will listen to senators that have issues and concerns that these services won't be up and running. We do have to consider these individuals who are going to receive these services. I have no doubt that the infrastructure will be available to do that, but if assurances need to be met or given, I will support that as well. But I support the concept. It's something we need to do.
