Senator Quandahl's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion was successful. The amendment has been adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Back to discussion of the advancement of the bill itself. Senator Quandahl, there are no lights on. He waives the opportunity to close. The question before the body is the advancement of LB 1047 to E & R Initial. All in favor of the motion to advance vote aye, those opposed nay. The question before the body is advancement of LB 1047. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 38 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 1047.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 1047 does advance. Items for the record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, a new study resolution, LR 267, Senator Aguilar; LR 268 by Senator Landis. Both will be referred to the Executive Board. Communication from the Governor to the Clerk. (Read re LB 16, LB 75, LB 279, LB 279A, LB 323, LB 449, LB 449A, LB 560, LB 560A, LB 818, LB 820, LB 821, LB 835, LB 836, LB 878, LB 911, LB 915, LB 927, LB 936, LB 937, LB 940, LB 947, LB 950, LB 961, LB 1033, LB 1069, and LB 1179.) Amendments: Senator Tyson, an amendment to LB 599; Senator Johnson, to LB 1099; Senator Wehrbein, to LB 1089. That's all that I have, Mr. President. (Legislative Journal pages 1155-1157.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. At 11:00 we did go to General File, special order. We completed that agenda item. We'll now return where we left off, on General File, budget related bills. We were at LB 1091. Mr. Clerk.
