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SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Preister. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. President, members of the body, could I ask Senator Vrtiska...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Vrtiska?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...on this...a question on this amendment? Mr. President, members, I wouldn't...claim number 03-699, you have reduced it about \$4,000. Did you say why you did that, or did I miss it, on Marsha Busse?

SENATOR VRTISKA: Oh. We haven't got that amendment yet, but I can get that if it's all right with the President.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Oh, we're not to that?

SENATOR VRTISKA: We haven't got to this claim yet.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. I'll...I will...I will wait and come back to that.

SENATOR VRTISKA: All right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The amendment before the body is AM3256 to the committee amendments. Further discussion? Seeing none, Senator Vrtiska, you may close on it.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Fifty-six is the one that I wanted to talk about. That's the one that Senator Wehrbein was inquiring about. And this is an...this is an amendment that reduces the amount of money that the committee decided to grant to a woman whose son's car was damaged by a ward of the state. And under state law, the state is not responsible for wards of the state, and so the Claims Committee had denied the claim. When it came to our committee, we looked at it. The lady was there and testified very emotionally about the whole issue, that their car
