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honestly think this is good policy to put in statute. I don't think I want to let some other agency director say, well, we're not going to validate Social Security cards anymore. We get one, we'll just accept it at face value. I don't think that's good state policy. So I'm going to oppose returning this bill to Select File and I'm trying to figure out what we do want to do as far as rectifying the discrepancy in the one year in one section of the bill, two in the other. I may should just refile my amendment. We'll see what happens to it. I realize it's 1:36. Perhaps I'll just, out of courtesy to the rest of the body, go ahead and ask possibly...I'm not doing it now, but think about passing over the bill and see if we can't get some other work done before we adjourn. With that, I'd return the rest of my time to the Chair. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Baker. Senator Synowiecki, there are no further lights. Is Senator...Senator Synowiecki, there are no further lights on. You're recognized to close on your motion to return.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Senator Baker, I just...are you going to continue with LB 559 today or are we going to pull it back? I'll yield some time to Senator Baker.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker.

SENATOR BAKER: Senator Synowiecki, it would be my intention at this time, we'll go ahead and pass over it, and see if we can't work something out. I...that's not saying I'm going ever agree to what you're proposing but I will try and work with Senator Bourne and get this language consistent throughout the bill, between the one form and two forms. So I know this is your time but I'm going to ask that we pass over LB 559 at this time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Synowiecki and Senator Baker. LB 559 is passed over. Speaker Bromm, did you wish to be recognized? Mr. Clerk, next bill.
