SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Is there any further discussion? If not, Senator Schrock, you're recognized to close, which he waives. The question before the body then is the adoption of LR 394. All in favor vote aye, and opposed nay.

CLERK: Mr. President, the proposed constitutional amendment LR 209CA was delivered to the Secretary of State at 4:44 p.m. (Legislative Journal page 1662.)

CLEKK: Mr. President, the next resolution, LR 400, was a resolution introduced by Senator Baker. It's found on page 1579 of the Journal.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker, to open on LR 400.
