Prohibit the impoundment of a neglected, abandoned or abused animal by law enforcement unless the animal's life is in danger; 2. Require that any animal which is impounded due to suspicion of animal abandonment, neglect or mistreatment be examined by a licensed veterinarian within 12 hours. If the veterinarian does not find probable cause of neglect, abandonment or mistreatment the animal shall be returned to the owner immediately; 3. Provides for an appeal to the county court when an animal is impounded on suspicion of abandonment, mistreatment or neglect. If the court finds insufficient evidence to convict the owner of animal abandonment, neglect or mistreatment pursuant to 28-1009 the animal shall be returned, and the state or local law enforcement agency shall pay the owner's legal fees, courts costs and expenses for the impoundment and care of the animal; 4. Provides that a citation for animal abandonment, neglect, or mistreatment shall provide the recipient 5 days to correct the violation; 5. Prohibits the sale, transfer, or offering for adoption of an animal impounded on suspicion of animal abandonment, neglect or mistreatment until after the conviction under 28-4009 is final; 6. Requires a court to prohibit a party purchasing or adopting an impounded animal from

selling the animal for a period of one year.
