This bill would eliminate the statute of limitation for certain felonies.

The Department of Correctional Services (DCS) states that the fiscal impact of this bill is not determinable. Their response follows:

LB129 eliminates the statute of limitations for certain felonies when DNA is present and a 13-loci DNA profile of such evidence has been developed.

While there is a possibility of more prosecutions in the future for felonies which currently have a statute of limitations on them (in many cases, currently three years), it is unknown how many more prosecutions would be brought or how many of them would result in incarceration with the Nebraska Department of Correctional Services (NDCS).. The fiscal impact is not determinable.

NDCS current inmate population is 4,599 (1/18/2011 Tuesday Count)
 The FY10 per diem (cost per day of feeding, clothing, housing, medical, etc) for an individual inmate was \$5,625/yr.
