LB 206 renames certain sections of statute as the Camper Unit Permit Act and includes new provisions relating to abandoned camper units. The bill defines abandoned camper units and provides procedures for state agencies, counties or municipalities to follow in disposing of abandoned campers. The bill also defines abandoned cabin trailers. A penalty is imposed for persons guilty of violating the provisions of the act regarding abandoned camper vehicles. The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) may promulgate rules providing for such forms and procedures to carry out the bill.

DMV indicates the bill will have no fiscal impact for the agency. The bill clarifies when a camper unit is considered to be abandoned and the procedures to be followed by state agencies, counties or cities in disposing of abandoned campers. It is unknown whether the bill will result in an increase in the number of abandoned campers being dealt with by the state or local entities. If so, then the state or local entities may have increased expenses involved in the removal, storage or sale of camper units. The entities may also have increased revenue from the sale of abandoned campers in some instances. No fiscal impact can be determined.

A penalty is imposed for those violating the provisions of the bill. Any revenue received from fines will accrue to the county where the violation occurred to be used by public schools.
