This bill establishes the Applied Behavioral Analysis Practice Act. This bill would require behavior analysis practitioners to be licensed. The practice of applied behavioral analysis means the design, implementation, and evaluation of systemic instructional and environmental modifications to produce socially significant improvements in human behavior. The Board of Psychology would oversee the regulation of applied behavioral analysis practitioners.

There are approximately 30 individuals who would be required to be licensed. The license for psychologists is \$183. The revenue generated from the fees would be \$5,490.
