LB 641 amends the Nebraska Liquor Control Act, Nebraska Revised Statutes Sections 53-134 and 53-197.

Section 53-134 is amended to provide that any law enforcement officer who determines that any provision of the Nebraska Liquor Control Act or local governing body ordinance, resolution, rule or regulation has been or is being violated shall report such violation in writing to the executive director of the Liquor Control Commission within 30 days of the violation.

Section 53-197 is amended to provide that every sheriff, deputy sheriff, police officer, marshal, or deputy marshal who knows or is credibly informed that any offense has been committed relating to the sale of alcoholic liquor shall report the offense in writing to the executive director of the Liquor Control Commission within 30 days of the violation or when the officer is informed of the offense.

There appears to be no fiscal impact to the state as a result of LB 641.
