Current statute provides that it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation, without having first applied for and obtained a permit in writing from the Department of Aeronautics, to build, erect or maintain any structure within the state, the height of which exceeds one hundred fifty feet above the surface of the ground at point of installation. At the present time there is no fee charged for this permit. LB 577 would establish a \$75 application fee that would accrue to the Department of Aeronautics Cash Fund.

In the last six months there have been 50 applications received by the Department of Aeronautics and it is anticipated that the number of applications could accellerate due to the recent interest in developing wind farms. The Department has conservatively estimated there will be 100 permits issued per year generating \$7,500 from the application fee.
