LB 1151 amends Nebraska Employment Security Law regarding the Nebraska Training and Support Trust Fund.

The bill provides that money in the Fund may be used in support of public and private on-site job training programs designed to train Nebraskans currently receiving unemployment insurance benefits.

The bill also instructs the Nebraska Worker Training Board to give priority in its annual program plan guidelines to training that results in employment for recipients of unemployment insurance benefits.

The Department of Labor indicates no fiscal impact as a result of LB 1152.

We find no basis to disagree with the Department's estimate of fiscal impact.
