The bill requires Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel to report the treatment and transportation of patients who have overdosed to the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS). DHHS then must report the information to the federal government's Overdose Mapping and Application Program (ODMAP). DHHS estimates needing \$20,000 for initial costs of updating systems and \$2,000 annually thereafter for maintenance and support costs. There is no basis to disagree with this estimate.

Explanation of Estimate:

LB 1320 requires Emergency Medical Services (EMS) to report the treatment and transportation of patients who have overdosed on drugs to the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS). DHHS would be responsible for reporting the information to the Federal government's Overdose Mapping and Application Program (ODMAP).

Current EMS patient data is transmitted to DHHS to the Office of Emergency Health Services (OEHS) using the Patient Care Reporting System. LB 1320 would require DHHS to establish and maintain electronic connections required to submit data to the ODMAP System. DHHS is currently in the procurement process to secure a vendor for upgrades and maintenance of the existing patient care reporting system. Therefore, general estimates are being provided based on similar IT projects. The estimated cost is approximately \$20,000 to establish the new data feed, with ongoing maintenance and support costs of approximately \$2,000 per year.

DHHS staff will need to obtain quotes for this work from the successful vendor, add an amended scope of work, and monitor the project to ensure successful completion. Review of the data connection and data sharing agreements would be needed to ensure that all data governance and IT security provisions are maintained as the feed is set up. Once the data connection is established, DHHS staff time should be minimal and could be absorbed by existing staff.

Refresher training by the DHHS EMS program to EMS providers and services should be performed to ensure awareness of the statutory changes and are entering data appropriately.

Funding for this project will be necessary due to insufficient funding available through the Emergency Medical Services Operations Fund. The external costs associated with LB 1320 is anticipated to be expensed from Program 033 – Administration, General Funds.
