Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

§37-201 amend the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission (NGPC) game law by creating a migratory waterfowl hunting season specifically for veterans, which will be the two days directly preceding the regular migratory waterfowl season. Any Nebraska resident veteran will be allowed to hunt this special veteran-only migratory waterfowl hunting season, as long as they have a valid hunting permit and all required stamps necessary for the hunting of migratory waterfowl in Nebraska. Additionally, this bill allows Nebraska resident veterans into park permit areas during this special season, without a Nebraska Park permit normally required for entry. The NGPC shall adopt rules and regulations for this new Nebraska resident veteran migratory waterfowl hunting season (i.e., verification of Nebraska resident veteran status, and bag limits).

The NGPC has estimated no determinable fiscal impact as a result of this bill. It would be difficult to identify which vehicles entering the parks without a park permit during these two-days, are those of these Nebraska resident veterans participating in the special veteran-only migratory waterfowl hunting season. Thus, NGPC is anticipating there would be a need to issue one-day or two-day park permits to these Nebraska resident veterans for this special hunting season.

This appears to be a reasonable assessment of the current bill. Many of those eligible Nebraska resident veterans would already have regular hunting permits, the necessary habitat and waterfowl stamps, and the additional Federal Duck stamp. This bill would likely have a negligible effect on their current park permit sales.
