This bill repeals the state-funded coverage in the Food Stamp Program, Medicaid, Aid to Dependent Children and Aid to the Aged, Blind and Disabled for non-United States citizens lawfully admitted into this country for permanent residence. The effective date of the act is July 1, 2007.

The federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Act Reconciliation Act of 1996 eliminated federal funding for legal permanent resident aliens until they have been in this country for 5 years. Nebraska covers assistance to these individuals with general funds. In FY 06, the following are the number of individuals who received these services: food stamps – 355; Medicaid – 465; Aid to Dependent Children – 158 and Aid to Aged, Blind and Disabled – 54. The savings would be \$2,961,566 in FY 08 and FY 09.
