LB 232 would amend the Nebraska Liquor Control Act to allow a community college which offers a culinary education program to apply for a Class I liquor license and upon receiving such license to obtain a catering license for the same period. A community college holding a catering license and a Class I license may then sell alcoholic beverages at events held by the culinary education program on the college campus and at events catered by the program.

The bill would also provide an exception for community college culinary education programs from the distance restrictions of section 53-177(2).

The Nebraska Liquor Control Commission states that no fiscal impact is expected.
