LB 582 would establish the Nebraska Invasive Species Council. The council would be directed to carry out a variety of planning, information-gathering and outreach functions related to the effects of invasive vegetation. The Department of Agriculture would provide administrative support for the council.

The extent of research, planning and outreach activities would largely depend upon the extent of legislative appropriations. If no additional funding was provided for Council activities, the work of the Council would be carried out at a level that existing Department of Agriculture resources could support. Additional funding would allow the agency to provide increased staffing support and funding for studies and outreach activities that are not currently included in the Bureau of Plant Industries budget. It is estimated that \$50,000 in annual General Fund support would provide for increased levels of staffing, research and outreach.
