LB 1036 repeals the existing Uniform Anatomical Gift Act and establishes the Revised Uniform Anatomical Gift Act. The bill has an operative date of January 1, 2011.

The bill establishes penalties for violations of the act. Persons may be convicted of a Class IIIA felony for certain violations regarding the purchase or sale of body parts or fraudulent acts for financial gain relative to anatomical gifts. The penalty for a Class IIIA felony is a minimum of one year in prison to a maximum of twenty years in prison and a fine of \$25,000 of both. The bill may have an impact on the prison and/or jail population because it adds language that could increase the number of persons prosecuted and convicted under its provisions. However, the fiscal impact is indeterminate because it is unknown how many persons will be sentenced pursuant to the bill. Any fines assessed pursuant to convictions will accrue to the county where the violation occurs to be used for the support of public schools. It is assumed the number of convictions will be small.
