- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to public records; to amend section 60-699,
- 2 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change provisions relating
- 3 to public records regarding motor vehicle accident reports; and to
- 4 repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 60-699, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

2 amended to read:

3 60-699 (1) The operator of any vehicle involved in an accident resulting in injuries or death to any person or damage to the property of 4 any one person, including such operator, to an apparent extent that 5 equals or exceeds one thousand five hundred dollars shall within ten days 6 7 forward a report of such accident to the Department of Transportation. Such report shall not be required if the accident is investigated by a 8 9 peace officer. If the operator is physically incapable of making the report, the owner of the motor vehicle involved in the accident shall, 10 within ten days from the time he or she learns of the accident, report 11 the matter in writing to the Department of Transportation. The Department 12 13 of Transportation or Department of Motor Vehicles may require operators involved in accidents to file supplemental reports of accidents upon 14 forms furnished by it whenever the original report is insufficient in the 15 opinion of either department. The operator or the owner of the motor 16 vehicle shall make such other and additional reports relating to the 17 accident as either department requires. Such records shall be retained 18 for the period of time specified by the State Records Administrator 19 pursuant to the Records Management Act. 20

- (2) The report of accident required by this section shall be in two 21 parts. Part I shall be in such form as the Department of Transportation 22 may prescribe and shall disclose full information concerning the 23 accident. Part II shall be in such form as the Department of Motor 24 Vehicles may prescribe and shall disclose sufficient information to 25 disclose whether or not the financial responsibility requirements of the 26 Motor Vehicle Safety Responsibility Act are met through the carrying of 27 liability insurance. 28
- (3) Upon receipt of a report of accident, the Department of Transportation shall determine the reportability and classification of the accident and enter all information into a computerized database. Upon

- 1 completion, the Department of Transportation shall electronically send
- 2 Part II of the report to the Department of Motor Vehicles for purposes of
- 3 section 60-506.01.
- (4) Such reports shall be without prejudice. Except as provided in 4 5 section 84-712.05, a report regarding an accident made by a peace officer, made to or filed with a peace officer in the peace officer's 6 7 office or department, or filed with or made by or to any other law enforcement agency of the state shall be open to public inspection, but 8 9 an accident report filed by the operator or owner of a motor vehicle pursuant to this section shall not be open to public inspection. Date of 10 birth information, excluding the year of birth, and operator's license 11 number information of an operator or owner included in any report 12 required under this section shall be confidential and shall not be a 13 14 public record under section 84-712.01. Year of birth information of an operator or owner included in any report required under this section 15 16 shall not be confidential and shall be a public record under section 17 84-712.01. The fact that a report by an operator or owner has been so made shall be admissible in evidence solely to prove compliance with this 18 19 section, but no such report or any part of or statement contained in the report shall be admissible in evidence for any other purpose in any 20 trial, civil or criminal, arising out of such accidents nor shall the 21 22 report be referred to in any way or be any evidence of the negligence or due care of either party at the trial of any action at law to recover 23 24 damages.
- (5) The failure by any person to report an accident as provided in this section or to correctly give the information required in connection with the report shall be a Class V misdemeanor.
