LEGISLATIVE BILL 1240

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to appropriate federal
- funds to the State Department of Education; and to declare an
- 3 emergency.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. (1) There is hereby appropriated (a) \$30,000,000 from
- 2 Federal Funds for FY2021-22 and (b) \$30,000,000 from Federal Funds for
- 3 FY2022-23 to the State Department of Education, for Program 25, for the
- 4 purposes described in subsection (2) of this section. The Federal Funds
- 5 appropriated in this section are from the funds allocated to the State of
- 6 Nebraska from the federal Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund pursuant
- 7 to the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Public Law 117-2,
- 8 Subtitle M, Sec. 9901.
- 9 (2)(a) There is included in the appropriation to this program for
- 10 FY2021-22 \$30,000,000 Federal Funds estimate for state aid, which shall
- 11 only be used for such purpose. There is included in the appropriation to
- 12 <u>this program for FY2022-23 \$30,000,000 Federal Funds estimate for state</u>
- 13 <u>aid, which shall only be used for such purpose.</u>
- 14 (b) There is included in the amount shown as aid for FY2021-22
- 15 \$30,000,000 Federal Funds estimate to provide family-directed education
- 16 recovery accounts for low-income children and families impacted by the
- 17 COVID-19 public health emergency. There is included in the amount shown
- 18 as aid for FY2022-23 \$30,000,000 Federal Funds estimate for family-
- 19 <u>directed education recovery accounts for low-income children and families</u>
- 20 <u>impacted by the COVID-19 public health emergency.</u>
- 21 <u>(c) The State Department of Education shall contract with an</u>
- 22 organization, or other capable vendor, by July 1, 2022, to administer a
- 23 three-year pilot program, for school years 2022-23, 2023-24, and 2024-25,
- 24 to provide family-directed education recovery accounts. The amount of
- 25 funding available for any school year shall be no more than \$20,000,000.
- 26 The department shall establish the application and application process
- 27 <u>with the selected organization or vendor. The administrative costs of the</u>
- 28 <u>selected organization or vendor shall not exceed ten percent of the</u>
- 29 <u>amount of funding provided in a school year.</u>
- 30 (d) A child shall be eligible to participate if the child (i) is a
- 31 Nebraska resident, (ii) attends a public, nonpublic, or exempt school in

- 1 grades kindergarten through 12, and (iii) has a family income that would
- 2 qualify for the federal free-lunch program. The total amount of an award
- 3 for a child shall not exceed \$2,000 for each school year of the program.
- 4 If there are not sufficient funds to award to all applicants, then first
- 5 priority shall be for a child with demonstrated academic deficiency in
- 6 <u>mathematics</u>, <u>science</u>, <u>or language arts</u>. The next priority shall be for a
- 7 child who has a sibling already receiving funding. The remaining
- 8 <u>applications shall be funded on a first come, first served basis.</u>
- 9 (e) Funds shall be used to address the learning loss resulting from
- 10 the COVID-19 public health emergency by paying for eligible educational
- 11 services. Eligible educational services include, but are not limited to,
- 12 <u>private school tuition, tutoring, digital-learning subscriptions, exempt</u>
- 13 school curriculum, and other K-12 educational services. Funds shall be
- 14 paid, upon written direction provided by a parent or guardian, to the
- 15 entity providing eligible educational services to the child. Funds may
- 16 not be used to purchase computing devices or equipment. Funding shall
- 17 continue with an eligible child from the time of the award for the
- 18 duration of the pilot program.
- 19 (f) By August 1 after the end of each school year of the pilot
- 20 program and by August 1 one year after the pilot program has ended, the
- 21 department shall collect available student performance data in
- 22 mathematics, science, and language arts and report, in the aggregate,
- 23 <u>such data to the Governor and the Legislature. Such report shall be</u>
- 24 <u>submitted electronically.</u>
- 25 (g) It is the intent of the Legislature that funding for family-
- 26 <u>directed education recovery accounts continue until FY2025-26.</u>
- 27 (h) Any administrative expenditures related to the use of Federal
- 28 Funds estimate appropriated pursuant to this section shall be expended
- 29 through the Federal Fund appropriation for administrative costs to the
- 30 <u>Military Department, Agency 31, Program 191.</u>
- 31 Sec. 2. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when

1 passed and approved according to law.
