- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Municipal Density and Missing Middle
- 2 Housing Act; to amend section 19-5504, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 3 Supplement, 2020; to change the contents of a report relating to
- 4 affordable housing as prescribed; to repeal the original section;
- 5 and to declare an emergency.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 19-5504, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

- 2 2020, is amended to read:
- 3 19-5504 (1) On or before July 1, 2021, and by each July 1 every two
- 4 years thereafter, each city shall electronically submit a report to the
- 5 Urban Affairs Committee of the Legislature detailing its efforts to
- 6 address the availability of and incentives for affordable housing through
- 7 its zoning codes, ordinances, and regulations. Such report shall include,
- 8 but not be limited to:
- 9 (a) An overview of the city's current residential zoning
- 10 requirements;
- 11 (b) The percentage of areas in the city zoned for residential use
- 12 which permit the construction of multifamily housing and middle housing;
- 13 (c) A breakdown of new residential construction in the city over the
- 14 previous five years, including the percentage of such construction that
- was single-family housing, multifamily housing, and middle housing;
- 16 (d) A breakdown of residential units annexed by the city over the
- 17 previous five years, including the percentage of such units that were
- 18 single-family housing, multifamily housing, and middle housing;
- (e) An estimate of the per-unit cost of housing in the city;
- 20 (f) Whether such zoning codes, ordinances, and regulations provide
- 21 for density bonuses or other concessions or incentives which encourage
- 22 residential density, and the frequency with which such bonuses,
- 23 concessions, or incentives are utilized;
- 24 (g) Whether such zoning codes, ordinances, and regulations allow the
- 25 construction of accessory dwelling units;
- 26 (h) What incentives the city applies to encourage the development of
- 27 affordable housing, including both direct incentives and regulatory
- 28 relief;
- 29 <u>(i) The percentage of areas in the city zoned for residential use</u>
- 30 which have been declared substandard and blighted areas under the
- 31 Community Development Law;

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- 1 (j) The percentage of areas in the city zoned for residential use
- 2 <u>which have been declared extremely blighted areas under the Community</u>
- 3 Development Law;
- 4 (k) (i) A demographic analysis of the city with trends and estimates
- 5 of the housing need classified by housing type and price range; and
- 6 $\frac{(1)}{(1)}$ Efforts to adopt an affordable housing action plan as
- 7 required under section 19-5505.
- 8 (2) The Urban Affairs Committee of the Legislature may require any
- 9 city to present its report to the committee at a public hearing.
- 10 Sec. 2. Original section 19-5504, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 11 Supplement, 2020, is repealed.
- 12 Sec. 3. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 13 passed and approved according to law.
