- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 43-536, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

2 2020, is amended to read:

43-536 (1) In determining the rate of reimbursement for child care, 3 4 the Department of Health and Human Services shall conduct a market rate 5 survey of the child care providers in the state. The department shall adjust the reimbursement rate for child care every odd-numbered year at a 6 7 rate not less than the sixtieth percentile and not to exceed the seventyfifth percentile of the current market rate survey, except that (a) (1)8 9 nationally accredited child care providers may be reimbursed at higher rates, (b) (2) an applicable child care or early childhood education 10 program, as defined in section 71-1954, that is participating in the 11 quality rating and improvement system and has received a rating of step 12 13 three or higher under the Step Up to Quality Child Care Act may be reimbursed at higher rates based upon the program's quality scale rating 14 under the quality rating and improvement system, and (c) (3) for the 15 16 fiscal year beginning on July 1, 2017, such rate may not be less than the 17 fiftieth percentile or the rate for the immediately preceding fiscal year, and for the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 2018, such rate may 18 not be less than the sixtieth percentile for the last three quarters of 19 the fiscal year or the rate for the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 20 2016, and for the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 2022, and the fiscal 21 year beginning July 1, 2023, such rate may not be less than the seventy-22 23 <u>fifth percentile</u>.

24 (2) It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate XXXX from 25 Federal Funds for FY2022-23 to the Department of Health and Human Services for the child care subsidy program established under section 26 68-1202. The Federal Funds to be appropriated pursuant to this section 27 28 are from the funds allocated to the State of Nebraska from the federal 29 Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund pursuant to the federal American 30

Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Public Law 117-2, Subtitle M, Sec. 9901.
