- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to amend section 85-1601, Reissue
- 2 Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to authorize the wearing of tribal
- 3 regalia by students as prescribed; to define a term; to change
- 4 provisions of the Private Postsecondary Career School Act; to
- 5 provide an operative date; and to repeal the original section.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. (1) A person who is a student attending a school which
- 2 meets the requirements for legal operation prescribed in Chapter 79 may
- 3 wear tribal regalia in any public or private location where the person is
- 4 otherwise authorized to be on such school grounds or at any school
- 5 function. Nothing in this section limits the authority of administrative
- 6 and teaching personnel to regulate student behavior as provided in
- 7 section 79-258 or the authority of a school to regulate student behavior
- 8 to further school purposes or to prevent interference with the
- 9 educational process.
- 10 (2) A school may adopt a policy to accommodate this section. Such
- 11 policy may specify the characteristics of any garment, jewelry, other
- 12 <u>adornment, or object that such school finds will endanger the safety of a</u>
- 13 <u>student or others or interfere with school purposes or the educational</u>
- 14 process if worn by a student during a specified activity.
- 15 (3) For purposes of this section, tribal regalia means traditional
- 16 garments, jewelry, other adornments, or similar objects of cultural
- 17 significance worn by members of an indigenous tribe of the United States
- 18 <u>or another country. Tribal regalia does not include any firearm or other</u>
- 19 <u>dangerous weapon. Tribal regalia also does not include, except in</u>
- 20 compliance with an appropriate federal permit, any object that is
- 21 <u>otherwise prohibited by federal law.</u>
- 22 Sec. 2. Section 85-1601, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 23 amended to read:
- 24 85-1601 Sections 85-1601 to 85-1658 and section 3 of this act shall
- 25 be known and may be cited as the Private Postsecondary Career School Act.
- 26 Sec. 3. (1) A person who is a student attending any private
- 27 postsecondary career school may wear traditional tribal regalia in any
- 28 public or private location where the person is otherwise authorized to be
- 29 <u>on such school grounds or at any school function. Nothing in this section</u>
- 30 limits the authority of administrative and teaching personnel of a
- 31 private postsecondary career school to regulate student behavior to

- 1 further school purposes or to prevent interference with the educational
- 2 process.
- 3 (2) A private postsecondary career school may adopt a policy to
- 4 accommodate this section. Such policy may specify the characteristics of
- 5 any garment, jewelry, other adornment, or object that such school finds
- 6 will endanger the safety of a student or others or interfere with school
- 7 purposes or the educational process if worn by a student during a
- 8 specified activity.
- 9 (3) For purposes of this section, tribal regalia means traditional

- 16 Sec. 4. (1) A person who is a student attending any postsecondary
- 17 institution may wear traditional tribal regalia in any public or private
- 18 location where the person is otherwise authorized to be on such school
- 19 grounds or at any school function. Nothing in this section limits the
- 20 <u>authority of administrative and teaching personnel of a postsecondary</u>
- 21 institution to regulate student behavior to further school purposes or to
- 22 prevent interference with the educational process.
- 23 (2) A postsecondary institution may adopt a policy to accommodate
- 24 this section. Such policy may specify the characteristics of any garment,
- 25 jewelry, other adornment, or object that such school finds will endanger
- 26 <u>the safety of a student or others or interfere with school purposes or</u>
- 27 the educational process if worn by such student during a specified
- 28 activity.
- 29 <u>(3) For purposes of this section:</u>
- 30 (a) Postsecondary institution has the same meaning as in section
- 31 85-2403; and

- 1 (b) Tribal regalia means traditional garments, jewelry, other
- 2 <u>adornments</u>, or <u>similar objects of cultural significance worn by members</u>
- 3 of an indigenous tribe of the United States or another country. Tribal
- 4 <u>regalia does not include any firearm or other dangerous weapon. Tribal</u>
- 5 regalia also does not include, except in compliance with an appropriate
- 6 federal permit, any object that is otherwise prohibited by federal law.
- 7 Sec. 5. This bill becomes operative on July 1, 2023.
- 8 Sec. 6. Original section 85-1601, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 9 Nebraska, is repealed.
