- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Medicine and Surgery Practice Act; to
- amend section 38-2001, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2020;
- 3 to define terms; to provide for perinatal mental health screenings;
- 4 to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 38-2001, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

- 2 2020, is amended to read:
- 3 38-2001 Sections 38-2001 to 38-2062 and sections 2 to 6 of this act
- 4 shall be known and may be cited as the Medicine and Surgery Practice Act.
- 5 Sec. 2. Licensed health care professional means a physician, an
- 6 <u>osteopathic physician, an advanced practice registered nurse, or a</u>
- 7 physician assistant licensed pursuant to the Uniform Credentialing Act.
- 8 Sec. 3. <u>Perinatal mental health disorder means a mental health</u>
- 9 <u>condition that occurs during pregnancy or during the postpartum period,</u>
- 10 <u>including depression, anxiety, or postpartum psychosis.</u>
- 11 Sec. 4. <u>Post-natal care means an office visit to a licensed health</u>
- 12 <u>care professional occurring after birth, with reference to the infant or</u>
- 13 <u>mother</u>.
- 14 Sec. 5. Prenatal care means an office visit to a licensed health
- 15 <u>care professional for pregnancy-related care occurring before birth.</u>
- 16 Sec. 6. <u>Questionnaire means a screening tool administered by a</u>
- 17 licensed health care professional to detect perinatal mental health
- 18 disorders, such as the Edinburgh Postnatal Depression Scale, the
- 19 <u>Postpartum Depression Screening Scale, the Beck Depression Inventory, the</u>
- 20 Patient Health Questionnaire, or other validated screening methods.
- 21 Sec. 7. The Board of Medicine and Surgery may work with accredited
- 22 hospitals and licensed health care professionals and may create a
- 23 referral network in Nebraska to develop policies, procedures,
- 24 information, and educational materials to meet each of the following
- 25 requirements concerning perinatal mental health disorders:
- 26 (1) Licensed health care professionals providing prenatal care may
- 27 provide education to pregnant patients and, if possible and with
- 28 permission, to their families about perinatal mental health disorders in
- 29 accordance with the formal opinions and recommendations of the American
- 30 <u>College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists;</u>
- 31 (2) Licensed health care professionals providing prenatal care at a

- 1 prenatal visit may invite each pregnant patient to complete a
- 2 questionnaire in accordance with the formal opinions and recommendations
- 3 of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists. Screening for
- 4 perinatal mental health disorders may be repeated when, in the
- 5 professional judgment of the licensed health care professional, the
- 6 patient is at increased risk for developing a perinatal mental health
- 7 disorder;
- 8 (3) Licensed health care professionals providing postnatal care may
- 9 invite each postpartum patient to complete a questionnaire and if
- 10 completed, shall review the questionnaire in accordance with the formal
- 11 <u>opinions and recommendations of the American College of Obstetricians and</u>
- 12 Gynecologists; and
- 13 (4) Licensed health care professionals providing pediatric care to
- 14 <u>an infant may invite the infant's mother to complete a questionnaire at</u>
- 15 any well-child checkup occurring during the first year of life at which
- 16 the mother is present, and if completed, shall review the questionnaire
- 17 in accordance with the formal opinions and recommendations of the
- 18 American Academy of Pediatrics, in order to ensure that the health and
- 19 well-being of the infant are not compromised by an undiagnosed perinatal
- 20 mental health disorder in the mother.
